THE MILLION CANS RECYCLING CONTEST

First Term Update



The Million Cans Recycling Contest is off to a great start. Nearly 170,000 cans were recycled in the first two months of the program. That is more than 4,800 pounds of aluminum circulated back into productive use. And, according to the <u>Can Manufacturers Institute's Can</u> <u>Calculator</u>, recycling 170,000 aluminum beverage cans saves enough energy to do 11,730 loads of laundry. Who wouldn't want to do 11,000 loads of laundry? Or maybe we should look at it another way. Recycling almost 5,000 pounds of aluminum prevents more than 16 million grams of greenhouse gas emissions. That is the same volume of emissions that would be produced by charging more than 2 million cell phones. High fives to all the students, teachers and staff who have gathered the used beverage cans so far. You're doing great! Keep it going. La Vega Elementary in Waco, TX, deserves a round of applause for gathering the most used beverage cans so far with a current count of 43,225. In Waco, students Andreas Cavazos, Vanesa Hernandez and Ryan Hernandez have been particularly amazing contributors to the recycling contest!

Yankeetown Elementary School in Newburgh, IN, however, leads the competition by collecting 608 cans per student. Well done Yankeetown! What a great way to roll into the new year.



PROMOTIONAL FUNDING

Don't forget that promotional funding is available for participating schools.

Each school will be reimbursed up to \$250 to promote their recycling campaign through whichever channel that the school choses. For example, the school may decide to promote the activity by:

- 1. Designing and placing posters and signs around the school or around the community.
- 2. Communicating to the PTA and parents.
- 3. Hosting special recycling events or recycling awareness spaces at normal school events (school carnivals, sporting events, music performances).

Additionally, a \$1000 promotional fund has been set aside to be split among the schools with the best promotional ideas. For a chance at the \$1,000, schools must submit a short summary of the idea and a budget to Scrap University Kids. The deadline for proposals has been extended to January 31, 2024. 
